The Lemon Challenge

May we use this שמיטה farmer as an example in our lives to set the tone of doing the 'ומסירת עכש even if it requires אמינוה

Raphael Mor Yoseph is a farmer in Sdei Zvi near the Gaza border. This story happened to him during the last Shemittah cycle. Raphael Mor Yoseph accepted upon himself to fully keep all the halachos of Shemittah. He owns 250 acres of large vegetable fields. He also has a huge lemon orchard. During shemittah, the price of lemons skyrocketed! Raphael Mor Yoseph arranged for the Otzar Bais Din to take his lemons and give them out, charging only enough to cover expenses.

One day, an Arab from a nearby village came by and saw the lemons. He offered to buy all the lemons at a very generous price. Raphael Mor Yoseph explained to the Arab that

it is a shemittah year, and selling produce (the lemons) is not permitted during shemittah!

The Arab left and returned to Raphael Mor Yoseph's farm a short while later. He brought with him a small suitcase. He placed it on the table in front of Raphael Mor Yoseph and told him to count the money in the suitcase that he was offering in exchange for the lemons. It was 300,000 shekels!!

Although this amount of money was really tempting, Raphael Mor Yoseph resisted the temptation.

He told the Arab:

"I'm sorry, but if you will give me a million shekel I cannot sell you the lemons.

They do not belong to me!!"

We have so much to learn from this farmer. Look how Raphael Mor Yoseph so happily and willingly gave up an opportunity to become so rich over a sale of lemons!

He did not let the יצר הרע win over his actions. He did what his whew was right. Raphael Mor Yoseph allowed the sense of in his heart to win over the "lemon sale".
