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"Contemplanting"





Jean Piaget, a classical theorist in children's cognitive development, believed that the child learns like a scientist through trial and error and manipulation of elements in his environment. In our second grade classroom we have our own little scientists who are hard at work learning about the growth process of plants.

Mrs. Goldberg introduced the lesson by distributing lima beans to the boys. The boys wrote their observations of the beans. They were hard and dry. Next, the boys let them stay overnight in a damp paper towel to begin the germination process. Then, next morning they observed how the beans had become wet and

soft. Many had small sprouts emerging from the bean. Some boys needed to wait longer to see growth, because each plant (not unlike our children) grows at its own pace. The sprouts were planted in a small greenhouse. The boys kept regular logs, like the good scientists that they are, recording all of their observations.

Once the sprouts had become too large for their small green-house, the boys "got their hands dirty" transferring the plants to pots with soil. They learned about adaptation. One boy described the Cheder's adaptation this school year. The next step will involve experimenting with

different environments that provide varied amounts of nutrients; air, sunlight, and water to determine which provides optimal conditions for the plants.

Mrs. Goldberg has been guiding our "scientists" through their varied experiments. She recognizes the tremendous value of hands on experiential learning. This project promoted a multisensory child centered approach to studying science. Mrs. Goldberg encouraged the students to ask questions and discuss their individual results at every stage. The boys collaborated and assisted each another throughout their research.

In the Pre1A Girls class another "medical professional" made a site visit, Dr. Patach. Morah Batsheva looked so real in her costume, that we almost thought she was a professional doctor! Dr. Patach taught us how to say "ahhhh," as "he" placed the tongue depressors in our mouths. We were very sad to see the doctor go back to his

work. Before leaving us, he rewarded us with doctor prizes for being such good patients! We will always remember Dr. Patach, and of course the sound he makes! We were glad to each create our own Dr. Patach projects for our Sefer Alef Bais. Some of us even dressed up as Dr. Patach too and "examined" the Aleph-Bais letters—listening to the sounds they can create.

Chinuch Corner

You are sitting in a lecture hall full of people listening to one of your favorite speakers. All of a sudden, there is a loud scream, "Help, help! Call 911! Someone collapsed!"

Apparently someone has had a heart attack. Some people quickly begin CPR right before your eyes. This makes you very jealous and you start to yell "It's not fair! I want CPR on me too! How come only he gets it!"

I think I know what your thinking, how absurd! Yet, perhaps at times we fall prey to this very idea with our own children.

Imagine that you are in a store

and you buy one child a treat for thinking of a great solution and another one of your children says, "It's not fair, I want something too!" Here's your chance! How will you respond? By "giving in" and giving the second child what he/she asked for because he felt it wasn't fair, we are in essence teaching our children to be jealous and not be happy with what they have. They will constantly look toward others and expect to get the same, because otherwise it is not fair.

However, if we teach them that he got what he got and you are someone else and deserve different things, it will begin to teach them that they don't always need what someone else has. I am I, who deserves what I need and not what my friend or sibling has.

In the short term it is much easier to give each child what the other has. One child has a bag of chips and the other complains and we can say "OK, here you go," and conversation over. Instead, invest the time and eneray to begin explaining this new idea. It probably won't be met with too many smiles! The correct way is more difficult, yet ultimately it will become easier because your children will begin to understand this concept and the issue will arise less and less b'ezras Hashem.
